What is Safeguarding?

It might be difficult to accept, but every child can be hurt, put at risk of harm or abuse, regardless of their age, gender, religion, ethnicity or socio-economic group.

Safeguarding legislation and government guidance says that safeguarding means:

- Protecting children from maltreatment
- Preventing impairment of children's health or development
- Ensuring that children are growing up in circumstances that are

- consistent with the provision of safe and effective care
- Taking action to enable all young people to have the best outcomes

And

"the action we take to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm- is everyone's responsibility. Everyone that comes into contact with children and families has a role to play".

Safeguarding at Stable Futures

At Stable Futures we are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all the young people in our care.

To ensure that we can deliver on this commitment, all our staff undertake continuous professional development and training in this area.

Details can be found in our safeguarding policy.

Staff are trained in looking out for signs of abuse and neglect. Staff will

report any concerns to the designated safeguarding lead (DSL), who will decide on the most suitable course of action.

The designated safeguarding lead is **Emily Clayton, the Centre Manager.** All staff that are working at Stable Futures, have a responsibly to read and understand all safeguarding policies and procedures.

All adults have access to all relevant documentation.

What constitutes as Child Protection Concern?

Abuse if a deliberate act of ill-treatment that can harm or is likely to harm a child or young person's safety, wellbeing and development. Abuse can be physical, sexual or emotional.

Neglect of a child or young person also constitutes abuse and can be defined

as failing to provide or secure for a child or young person the basic needs of physical safety and wellbeing.

It is important to remember, however, that abuse may not necessarily fall easily into these categories, and can be difficult to 'spot'.

What can you do to help?
